APPENDIX B – CASUAL DRESS DAY CODE

PURPOSE

• To ensure all students are dressed appropriately at all times. • To provide a framework for management of the student dress code on Casual Dress Days.

SCOPE

This policy applies to all students at Cranbourne West Secondary College.

POLICY

This dress code will;

- Allow freedom of expression without disregarding College policy and expectations.
- Be well publicised and clearly explained to all students and their parents/guardians.

Implementation

- Briefing all staff to make everyone aware of the of student dress code for Casual Dress days.
- Information to be included in College newsletters regularly, especially before a Casual Dress day, to allow parents/guardians to become familiar with the dress requirements.
- If a student is deemed to be inappropriately dressed or refuses to adjust their clothing to abide with the policy, then the following options could apply:
 - Classroom teachers tell students to adjust their clothing to abide by the code. If this is not possible or the student refuses, then the student is to be reported to CWSC Leadership
 - A phone call to parents/guardians to discuss new clothes being delivered to College.
 - Sending the child home to be appropriately dressed.
 - If the above consequences are unable to be implemented, then other appropriate consequences may be applied.

Inappropriate Dress

Items listed below may be deemed as inappropriate dress;

- See-through tops
- Boob-tube tops
- See-through tops

- Strapless topsCropped or short shirts that display midriff
- Open toed shoes
- Rude or offensive prints on clothing
- Mini-skirts
- Visible underwear
